Agenda:

Thursday, June 26th

- Arrive at LAMI around 5:00PM
- Dinner ashore prior to Boarding
- Board Ship around 7:00 PM, Find Bunk, Stow gear, Relax Aboard
- Sleep on boat

Friday, June 27th

- Breakfast
- Stow gear and help crew to make ready to sail
- Cast off, sail cross San Pedro channel to Catalina Harbor, Catalina Island
- Lunch underway
- Drop Anchor, Settle boat
- Dinner
- Sleep on boat

Saturday, June 28th

- Breakfast
- Decision on Going Ashore or Stay with Boat
- Hoist Anchor
- Sail Around West End to Emerald Bay
- Lunch aboard
- Raise hook, Sail to Isthmus Harbor
- Drop Anchor, Shore boat to Island
- Dinner ashore at Harbor Reef Restaurant
- Return to boat via Shore Boat
- Settle boat
- Sleep on Boat

Sunday, June 29th

- Breakfast
- Make boat ready and raise anchor
- Sail back to LAMI, San Pedro
- Lunch aboard
- Arrive Dockside Approximately 2:00 PM
- Secure boat, Remove Personal belongings off boat
- Return Home

Payments

Two Payments for the trip will occur.

Deposit: \$ 250.00 Paid one week prior (November 25th) to the December 2nd deadline.

Final Balance Payment: Final \$ 250.00 is due June 12th, 2025 (two weeks prior to the voyage) also non-refundable.

Recommended Gear/Clothing for 3 day Voyage Trip:

Note PFD not required for trip per se

- Soft-sided Duffle bag or Backpack
- Sleeping Bag (e.g. Rectangular Coleman or similar)
- Pillow (optional)
- PJ's
- Refillable water bottle (essential item)
- Hot liquid mug (coffee, Hot chocolate, etc.)
- Hand towel, wash cloth
- Beach towel
- Cap or hat for sun
- Sweater, sweatshirt, and/or light jacket (several layers of warm clothing as summer days can be cold at sea, fleece is best)
- Rain/Wind proof shell
- Long pant(s) (jeans, Khakis, Sweats)
- Shorts, T-shirts, & Socks
- Short and Long Sleeve Shirts (quick dry is better)
- Soft soled, non-slip, non-marring shoes for aboard boat
- Hiking shoes/boots (if hiking)
- Swimsuit(s)
- Plastic Bag to hold wet items/laundry
- Flip Flops/Water shoes for beach
- Toiletry articles, including toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, shampoo, conditioner, etc.
- Flash light, head lamp (red light is best for moving at night)
- Sunscreen (SPF 50 or higher)
- Ear plugs if you are a light sleeper (people snore, just sayin)
- Optional Sea Sickness Remedy (Ginger chews, Bonine, etc.)
- Personal medications (Logged with Safety Officer aboard)
- Quarters for showers at Isthmus Harbor (8 qtrs./ 3 min)
- Do Not Bring: Fishing gear, Blow dryers, Flat irons, Curling irons, Glass containers
- Optional Gear: Brought but with a nod to stowage and space considerations
 - Snorkel gear (Mask snorkel, fins, wetsuit – Water is cold)
 - Camera gear, this will be an amazing photo op trip

A note about adult beverages (contain alcohol)

The policy is straight forward and easily managed. No drinking two hours before departure. No drinking while underway. Once the boat is secured or anchored, only then, with captains permission, will it be permitted aboard the ship.

Water is of course available but it is best to have a refillable container with you so we don't generate as much plastic trash. The other soft drinks we bring will be up to us as we provision the boat.

Basic Rules Aboard

- 1> The Captain runs the ship along with the Mate and the Crew hands. They will ask us to divide up into teams and assist them with tasks. This gives us an opportunity to not only see how a boat works firsthand but also lets us participate in its running.
- 2> Remember the golden rule. We all are aboard on what will be an amazing adventure. Positivity and courtesy are critical to making sure the trip is enjoyed by all.
- 3> The boat is rather large and yet you will find it gets tight in some spots. Patience and looking out for your fellow passengers is always helpful.

- 4> A ship shape boat is a beautiful thing to behold. Try to keep your gear and items stowed neatly during the trip. Like all vessels at sea, loose items may find a different location if not secured.
- 5> Many ask about the option of going aloft or out on the bowsprit. Yes, you can when the crew of the boat say it is okay to do. They will have things that they require of you to safely do so.
- 6> Many hands make small work. This is true for the running of the ship but also for the various tasks aboard (i.e. helping carry and distribute meals as well as cleaning up and proper management of trash. Cooperative efforts make it better for all.
