

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN (EAP)

SCOPE:

AYC Birthday Regatta, Feb-14 - 16
On-the-water / afloat emergencies

EMERGENCY EXAMPLES:

Minor Emergencies: non-life threatening injury or illness, mild hypothermia, person-in-water needing help
Major Emergencies: life-threatening injury or illness, significant blood loss, heart-attack, stroke, heat exhaustion, hypothermia, near-drowning, broken bones, missing person.

PRINCIPAL RACE OFFICER (PRO):

In-charge of on-the-water Emergencies
Coordinates response & communications

RESPONSE RESOURCES:

AYC Mark-set Boat
Coast Guard Auxiliary: 2-boats
Peoria Fire Dept. (PFD) : advanced medical, CPR, Fire

COMMUNICATIONS:

VHF CH 68: Working comms (Peoria Fire unable to use)
VHF CH 16: Emergency comms (**Peoria Fire monitors**)

- Meet-up point for transferring victim / patient to Peoria Fire or to AYC for ground transportation to Emergency Room.



DRIVING DIRECTIONS:

- Time / distance: ~13-minutes / ~10-miles



1. exit Pleasant Harbor
2. turn RIGHT onto Old 87th Ave and travel SOUTH for 1.8-miles
3. turn LEFT onto Carefree Highway
4. travel 1.8-miles EAST
5. at the light turn RIGHT onto Lake Pleasant Pkwy
6. travel 5.5-miles SOUTH on Lake Pleasant Pkwy
7. turn RIGHT into the North Peoria Emergency Center parking lot
